## **Additional Services and Classes Offered at Catholic Charities:**

**2. Pregnancy and Parenting** - Supportive counseling and parenting information for women who are pregnant and/or have a child under one-year old. These services are also available for biological fathers. Additional services include free and confidential pregnancy testing and free baby care items.

**3. Anger Management**- Helps people manage their emotions and behavior in appropriate ways. Men's and women's groups available.

**4. Basic Needs Assistance**- Emergency help with utilities (Dollar Energy Fund and Columbia Gas CAP); disaster relief.

**5. Counseling** - Individual, family, couples and marriage. Counseling is based on a sliding fee scale. No one is turned away because of inability to pay. Evening appointments available.

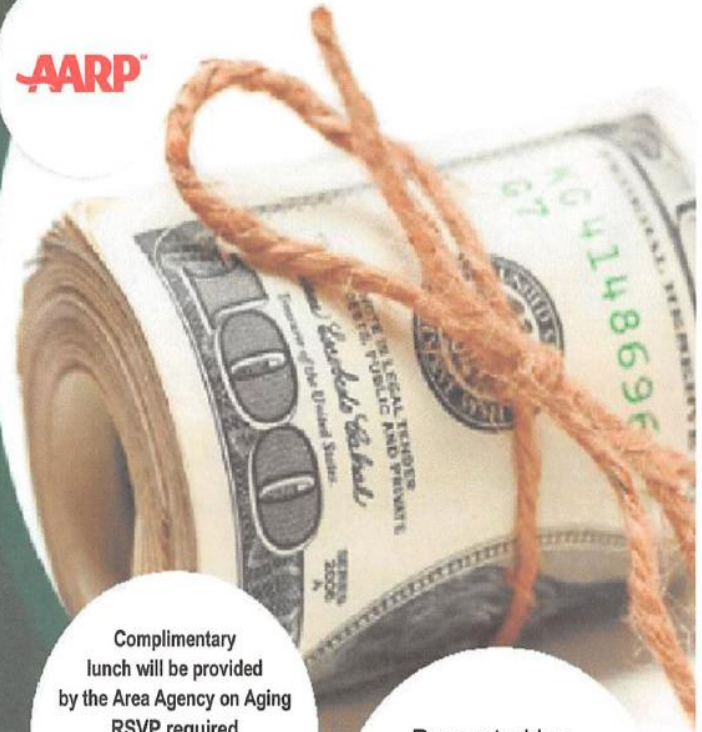
